Courses in English

Exchange students can choose <u>English taught bachelor</u> <u>courses</u> of their interest. *Only by exception*, exchange students can follow individual courses of the Master Programmes. Interested exchange students are obliged to contact the programme coordinator prior to submitting their learning agreement.

Radboud Minors

We offer a variety of <u>Radboud Minors</u>, from which students can choose. These are tailor-made course options clustered around a certain theme of field of interest. After successful completion of a Radboud Minor, students will receive an official certificate signed by the Rector Magnificus. *Please note*: courses may have entry requirements (prerequisites) which can be found in the course details.

Language requirements

All exchange students are required to master the English language on (proven) B2 level.

Services for Exchange Students

Housing

For exchange students, there are two possible ways to arrange accommodation in Nijmegen:

A request for assistance can be made by indicating on your online application that you need housing. The Housing department will do its utmost to find housing for you, but cannot give any guarantees.

A furnished room with shared kitchen, toilet and shower facilities will rent for approximately up to €400 per month.

Costs of living

Based on experiences of prior exchange students, we have made estimations on living expenses:

- Study material, books, lecture notes, photocopies etc. approximately € 350,-
- Food and drink, travel expenses, clothing and personal care etc. approximately € 2000,-
- Accommodation approximately € 2500,-
- Insurance, health, personal liability etc. approx. € 500,-
- Visa and residence permit etc. approximately €300,-
